

Nov. 13, 2020 Superintendent's Update: Students, Parents/Legal Guardians, and Staff

We are excited to welcome our students and staff back to school next week after a well-earned break. I hope that everyone comes back rejuvenated, enthused and ready to continue growing in faith and knowledge together.

On Nov. 12, Premier Kenney introduced <u>targeted public health measures</u> that, while not directed at schools, reinforce our current health measures and also introduce some additional considerations for programming:

- given current restrictions in the community regarding group fitness, classes, and team sports, we are focused on offering more outdoor and individual physical activities in Phys. Ed., and, similarly, modified academy programming in designated schools between Nov. 13 and 27; and
- we will continue to follow Alberta Health Services (AHS) <u>health guidelines</u> on singing, dancing, and performing arts.

Given the rising spread of the virus, both locally and provincially, we are working closely with AHS and surrounding school authorities to enact measures necessary to mitigate the risks of further transmission.

It is important that you continue to use the <u>COVID-19 Alberta Health Daily Checklist for Children Under 18</u> (available in <u>English</u>, <u>French</u>, and <u>nine other languages</u>) every day, prior to sending your child(ren) to school. If your child is ill or has any symptoms, even if they seem mild, please keep him or her at home, call 8-1-1, and follow all instructions for testing and isolating. AHS's <u>Guidance for Parents of Children Attending School and/or Childcare</u> provides helpful information and answers to frequently asked questions. As you know, the situation around this pandemic continues to change rapidly. Up-to-date and credible information is available from the <u>Government of Alberta</u>, <u>AHS</u>, <u>Health Canada</u>, and the <u>World Health</u> <u>Organization</u>. Please also review our updated <u>Parent Guidebook for School Re-Entry: 2020-2021</u>, visit our <u>website</u>, and follow us on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram to stay in the loop. Your child(ren)'s school principal can best address your concerns as they apply to <u>your child(ren's) school</u>.

We look forward to the <u>Grand Re-Opening Celebration and Blessing</u> of <u>St. Gabriel Education Centre</u> (formerly St. Gabriel High School) on November 20. Our Board of Trustees <u>approved the formal name change</u>, which came into effect on August 31, to reflect the growing scope with which the school serves its students and the broader community. Due to restrictions around COVID-19, this event will not be open to the public to attend on site; however, the formal program will be <u>livestreamed</u> to the community, and the recording will be posted online shortly after the celebration.

There is no place for bullying in our schools, and we thank you for helping build welcoming, safe, and caring environments that respect diversity and support a sense of belonging.

These are challenging times, but we will get through them together as we continue to trust God. As I reflect on the many ways our community supports and prays for one another, I call to mind words from the letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to Philemon:

"When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus...I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you..." (Philemon 1:4-7).
