Superintendent's Update: Students, Parents/Legal Guardians, and Staff

Our students and staff are excited to be back in class this week! Staff are thrilled to see their students and colleagues again, and, likewise, students are happy to see their classmates and teachers. Whether in an online or face-to-face environment, everyone is settling back into his or her learning routines.

As we continue to navigate these challenging times together, may the words of St. Bonaventure encourage us: God is "within all things but not enclosed; outside all things, but not excluded; above all things, but not aloof; below all things, but not debased." Bonaventure spoke of God as One "whose centre is everywhere and whose circumference is nowhere." It is reassuring to know that God is always with us, even in difficult circumstances.

Families are required to continue using the <u>COVID-19 Alberta Health Daily Checklist for Children Under 18</u> (available in <u>English</u>, <u>French</u>, and <u>nine other languages</u>) <u>daily</u>, <u>before</u> sending their child(ren) to school. If your child is ill or has any symptoms, even if they seem mild, please keep him or her at home, call 8-1-1, and follow all instructions for testing and isolating. The <u>Guidance for Parents of Children Attending School and/or Childcare</u>, from Alberta Health Services (AHS), provides helpful information and answers to frequently asked questions. Given the rising spread of the coronavirus, both locally and provincially, we continue to work closely with AHS and surrounding school authorities to enact measures necessary to mitigate the risks of further transmission.

As the situation around this pandemic continues to change rapidly, we encourage you to regularly visit the <u>Government of Alberta</u>, <u>AHS</u>, <u>Health Canada</u>, and the <u>World Health Organization</u> websites, where you can find up-to-date and credible information about COVID-19. Please also review our updated <u>Parent Guidebook for School Re-Entry: 2020-2021</u>, visit our <u>website</u>, and follow us on <u>Facebook</u>, <u>Twitter</u>, and <u>Instagram</u> to stay in the loop. Your child(ren)'s school principal can best address your concerns as they apply to <u>your child(ren's) school</u>.
