GOOD NEWS

- An update on transportation delivery, changes implemented that are increasing service delivery and ensuring the safety of all students as well as challenges in providing service across the District. Historic transportation fees were shared noting that increases have been kept to a minimum. The projected cost to deliver service this year is expected to be on budget.

• Correspondence received from Alberta Education's Field Services department was shared. The letter commended the District on its 2014/2015-2016/2017 Three Year Education Plan and 2013/2014 Annual Education Results Report.
