## **REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

The last regular meeting of the Board was at the District Office, on Monday, February 22, 2016.

## **GOOD NEWS**

- The Board commended ESSMY on their Chapel unveiling event that took place; Archbishop Richard Smith was in attendance to bless the Chapel.
- The MCHS Community was recently blessed with donations from Landrex Homes in support of their industrial shop, and from Champion Pet Foods to help support their studio operations and their Urban Agriculture program. Thank you to both of these organizations for supporting students and enhancing their program experience!

#### **Development and Peace News**

- Funds raised will go directly to the Philippines Partnership Project that was established between the Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools and Development and Peace to support survivor communities of Super Typhoon Haiyan.
