Earlier this week, we had to face the reality that we must temporarily reduce staffing because of the provincial government's need to fund emergent health services and supplies as a result the COVID-19 pandemic. We value all of our teaching and support staff; all are integral to our work and the continued success of our students. To address the shortfall in funding from the province, we are working with school and division administrators to identify staff who will carry forward online learning as we live through COVID-19. As well, your board of trustees will be vigilant in ensuring our resourcing needs are sufficient to meet the needs of our students.
