SUBJECT: PAT and DIP Results

BACKGROUND:

This is a report on our students' 2019 provincial achievement test (PATs) and 2019-2020 diploma examination (DIPS) results. Because of the pandemic, the province announced that students would not write provincial achievement tests and diploma exams in May and June 2020. Therefore, there is no October Accountability Pillar with updated PAT and DIP results for 2020. Jurisdictions provincially are using their 2019 PAT results and 2019-2020 DIP results to report on areas of strength and focus for their Annual Education Results Reviews (AERR) and Division Education Assurance Plans due November 30, 2020.

- <u>Standard of Excellence</u>: Grade 6 students performed at <u>Excellent</u> or <u>Good</u> for <u>1 out of 5</u> standards at the <u>Standard of Excellence</u> for ALL core subjects and <u>above (+1.3) the province</u> at the <u>Standard of Excellence</u> for ALL core subjects.
- <u>Annual Education Results Report 2019-2020</u>: We have **no areas** of required improvement to report to the province.
- <u>Assurance 2020-2021</u>: Based on Fig. 1.0, we celebrate our **excellent results** in **English** Language Arts (ELA) 6 (Acceptable Standard, Standard of Excellence); and Math 6 and Science 6 (Acceptable Standard).

We will continue to focus on French Language Arts (FLA) 6 at the Acceptable Standard and Social 6 at the Standard of Excellence.

Division-wide professional learning is designed to improve formative assessment strategies through practice progressions and differentiation of instruction. We have a part-time French Immersion Lead who is working one-on-one and in small groups in French Immersion schools on targeted research-based practices in teaching narrative writing and reading (associating meaning).

- <u>Acceptable Standard</u>: Grade 9 students performed at <u>Excellent or Good</u> for 5 out of 10 standards at the <u>Acceptable Standard</u> for ALL core subjects. Grade 9 students <u>outperformed</u> (+14.5) the province the <u>Acceptable Standard</u> for ALL core subjects.
- <u>Standard of Excellence</u>: Grade 9 students performed at <u>Excellent or Good</u> for **2 out of 10 standards** at the **Standard of Excellence** for ALL core subjects. Grade 9 students performed **slightly below (-1.9)** the province at the **Standard of Excellence** for ALL core subjects.
- <u>Annual Education Results Report 2019-2020</u>: We have **one area (Math 9)** to report to the province for improvement.
- <u>Assurance 2020-2021</u>: Based on Fig. 2.0, we will continue to **celebrate** our continuous excellence in Science 9, Social 9; and Knowledge and Employability (K & E) subjects (Math, Science, Social) at the Acceptable Standard; and ELA 9 (K & E) and Math 9 (K & E) at the Standard of Excellence.

We will continue to focus on FLA 9, Math 9, and ELA 9 at the Acceptable Standard; Science 9, Science 9 (K&E), and Social 9, (K & E), and FLA 9 at the Standard of Excellence. We will continue professional learning support of French and English teachers in Math 9 (Part A & B), and FLA 9 and ELA 9 (Reading-associating meaning; Writing- business letter). Last year, with a concentrated PD focus on improving content and organization in writing, our business letter results improved markedly.

- Acceptable Standard: Grade 12 students performed at Excellent or Good for 6 out of 9 standards at the
 Acceptable Standard for ALL core subjects. Grade 12 students performed about the same (+0.8) as the
 province at the Acceptable Standard for ALL core subjects.
- <u>Standard of Excellence</u>: Grade 12 students performed at <u>Excellent or Good</u> for 6 out of 9 standards at the <u>Standard of Excellence</u> for ALL core subjects. Grade 12 students <u>outperformed (+2.2)</u> the province at the Standard of Excellence for ALL core subjects.
- Annual Education Results Report 2019-2020: Last year, we had the following areas to report on to the
 province for improvement: French Language Arts 30-1, and English 30-2 (Acceptable Standard); and
 Social 30-1 (Acceptable Standard and Standard of Excellence); and Chem. 30 and Physics 30 (Standard
 of Excellence).
- Assurance 2020-2021: Based on Fig. 3.0 and Fig. 4.0, we will celebrate improvements in English 30-1, English 30-2, Chem. 30, and Physics 30 (Acceptable Standard). We will also celebrate overall excellence in sciences (Sci. 30, Bio. 30, Chem. 30, Physics 30) at the Acceptable Standard; Sci. 30 and Physics 30 at the Standard of Excellence); and Math 30-1 at the Acceptable Standard and Standard of Excellence.
- We will focus on English 30-1 and Social 30-1 (Acceptable Standard) that had slight declines; and Math 30-1 and 30-2 (French and English), Social 30-1 (French and English), Bio 30 and Chem. 30 at the Standard of Excellence.

SLQS CONNECTION: The rationale for providing this report aligns with the SLQS in the following ways:

Competency: Supporting Effective Governance

• Indicators: Ensuring that all students in the school authority have the opportunity to meet the standards of education set by the Minister of Education.

Competency: Modeling Commitment to Professional Learning

• Indicators: Engaging teachers, principals, school jurisdiction leaders, school community and local community members to establish a shared understanding of current trends and priorities in the education system.

Competency: Visionary Leadership

• Indicators: Promoting in the school community a common understanding of and support for the school authority's goals, priorities, and strategic initiatives.

RESULTS OR ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES:

- **GRADE 6 FRENCH LANGUAGE ARTS:** We expect to see improvements in students' performance in narrative writing and in reading (associating meaning).
- **GRADE 9 MATH:** We expect to see improvements in students' performance in both parts (Part A and B) in Math in English and French.
- **GRADE 9 ELA AND FLA:** We expect to see improvements in students' performance in in writing the business letter in English and French.
- GRADE 12 FRENCH 30-1 and ENGLISH 30-2: We expect to continue to see improvements in students' performance in English writing (using supportive evidence) and in reading (infer, apply, analyze) and French writing (critical analysis of texts). We also seek to focus on specific areas for improvement in Social 30-1 (understanding and analysis of issues) through collaborative opportunities for ongoing professional learning. Science teachers continue to collaborate and contribute to differentiation of resources to improve the Standard of Excellence in Chemistry and Biology.
- **Provincial Achievement Tests:** We chose not to proceed with achievement tests in grade 6 and 9 due to the pandemic. We felt that it was not a standardized year and therefore standardized tests would not be fair assessments of all students' capabilities.
- **Diploma Examinations:** On October 13, 2020, Minister LaGrange announced that students would have the choice as to whether or not to write diploma exams in November 2020. Because she noted that it had been a "challenging" time to gain momentum and consistency in programming, it is reasonable for students to choose not to write standardized diploma exams.
- Assessment Focus: We are taking this time in 2020-2021 to explore robust formative and summative assessments and collaborative professional learning to cocreate and share strategies and resources.
