## Superintendent's Update: Students, Parents/Legal Guardians, and Staff

Happy Mother's Day! As we celebrate all of the mothers in our GSACRD family on Sunday, May 9th, we remember Mary, the Blessed Virgin. She is a perfect example of gentle and unconditional motherly love. <u>May, the month dedicated to the veneration of Mary</u>, allows us to examine her strength in adversity and her unwavering trust in God. Mary lived a fully human experience and accepted it with grace and courage.

This week has seen a number of announcements from Premier Kenney in regards to stricter restrictions to 'stop the spike' of COVID-19. Most recently, it was announced that all kindergarten to grade 12 students in Alberta will be learning online, effective Friday, May 7, 2021. We anticipate a return to face-to-face instruction on Tuesday, May 25th, 2021.

Please note the following:

- All K-12 students will be learning from home.
- Pre-Kindergarten programs continue with face-to-face learning.
- Students with exceptional learning needs may continue to access face-to-face learning as required. This is to be done in discussion with school administration.

We want to take this opportunity to thank our school administrators, teachers, and support staff for their efforts to 'pivot' to online learning seamlessly once again this school year. On the same token, we are grateful to our students and families for their flexibility and understanding. We look forward to having all of our students back in our halls - safe and healthy! In addition, Premier Kenney announced that, starting Tuesday, May 4th, 2021, all those who work in schools, regardless of age, will be eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. Further to this, on Monday, May 10, 2021, all Albertans 12 years of age and older will be able to book a COVID-19 vaccine. We pray that our staff and students who wish to be vaccinated find an added measure of safety in these vaccines, and that this marks the beginning of a return to normalcy.

We will continue to adhere to the most current public health measures and update our <u>Parent Guidebook</u> for School Re-Entry: 2020-2021, as well as our <u>website</u> and official social media channels (<u>Facebook</u>, <u>Twitter</u>, and <u>Instagram</u>), which are also reliable sources of Division news.

Just a final reminder that we are inviting nominations for the Laura Bird Memorial Beacon of Hope Award, which recognizes a staff member who has demonstrated self-sacrifice through Christian service and has accepted demanding challenges for the betterment of education.
